

12th GRADE SYLLABUS – 5 POINT STUDENTS
2016-2017

At the end of this year students will be tested on Module F (Literature), Module G and an oral exam.

Teachers:

Module F:

Instead of the external literature Bagrut exam, teachers will write and mark their own internal exam. The exam will be given at the end of the year, and will test the pieces of literature that have been taught in this year.

LOTS, HOTS and Bridging Text and Context questions.

Texts for the Bagrut exam:

All My Sons / Arthur Miller (a play)

The Enemy / Pearl S. Buck (a short story) – will be tested in the end of the year

The following are the higher-order thinking skills that are required to be taught to students answering the extended HOTS question:

- **Comparing and contrasting**
- **Distinguishing different perspectives**
- **Explaining cause and effect**
- **Explaining patterns**
- **Inferring**
- **Uncovering motives**

Module G:

- 1 Unseen (60p.): article, descriptive texts such as personal account/ human interest article, informative texts, report, reviews such as books, films

Writing (40p.): composition, letter: essay expressing an opinion on a given subject, including arguments for and against and examples

The Oral Exam:

Students will be tested by external teachers from other schools who are appointed by the Testing Department. The oral exam includes 2 parts: 1) an interview (40%) 2) project (60%). Students will be asked to present their project and to answer questions about it. The student **MUST** bring his project for the exam otherwise he/she will not be tested on it. The maximum grade for the oral exam without the project is 40.

Tests:

- Students must bring their own dictionaries to tests and quizzes.
- Students will not attend a make-up test without the English teacher's *or* the English coordinator's authorization.
